Additional Comments about Workflow:	The focus of the fellowship can be on diagnostic imaging or non-vascular intervention, as preferred by the candidate. Several ablation procedures are performed under general anesthesia for increased patient comfort and technical freedom. Exposure to contrast-enhanced ultrasound (CEUS) and quantitative liver imaging can be offered.
