### WORKFLOW

**General structure** Time is spent between the Civic and General campus, with majority of rotations at Civic. 4-week blocks in CT, MR, Spine, head and neck, angiography, elective.

Pediatric neuroradiology rotation 2-blocks is at the Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto.

<b>Are there times when fellows overlap and share work?</b>	No, each fellow is on a different rotation.
<b>How many rounds are you expected to attend? Contribute to?</b>	Neuroscience rounds (with Neurology and Neurosurgery), Head and Neck rounds, Neurosurgery rounds, Fellows Hot seat rounds, Neuro pathology round and academic afternoons.  Contribute to: Leading radiology resident teaching rounds (cases) 1hr long, approximately once a month. Present cases for Neuropathology, ENT and Neurosurgery round.

<b>How procedure focused is the fellowship?</b>	Moderate focus
<b>Which procedures are you responsible for?</b>	Fellows are encouraged to participate in all spine interventions including lumbar punctures, spinal injections, rhizotomy, myelograms and vertebroplasty.

<b>What are the Research Expectations?</b>	Fellows are expected to complete 1 IRB-approved project during course of program with presentation at annual research day.

<b>General</b>	Frequency: 1 in 4. Home call. Call responsibilities start after 10 PM on weekdays. Reporting from the hospital with the on call Neuroradiologist during the morning on weekends.
<b>Responsibilities on Call:</b>	General comments: Residents are first call. Fellows to be available as first backup for neuroradiology.  Reporting from the hospital during the morning on weekends.  Modalities covered: CT and MR. Average number of cases per call shift on weekend 40-50 studies.
