The Centre Hospitalier de l'Université de Montréal (CHUM)

The CHUM is the largest hospital in the province of Quebec and is the main teaching campus for the University of Montreal. The CHUM Super-Hospital was recently constructed, opened its doors to patients in 2017 and is a state-of-the-art modern medical oasis in the heart of Old Montreal. It consists of 772 beds, 1100 physicians, 34 cutting edge operating rooms as well as 12000 ancillary staff and state of the art medical, surgical and radiological technologies.

The CHUM's Vision

The CHUM is an internationally renowned centre of excellence, offering an integrated population-based healthcare approach throughout a well-defined continuum in all areas of its mission; patient care, teaching, research, management and innovation. This approach is achieved through partnerships with both patients and the public. The CHUM's vision is reflected in all of its medical and surgical divisions, as well as its management teams. To achieve these goals, a step-wise approach toward patient care trajectories has been implemented using bioinformatics and artificial intelligence.

The CHUM collaborates with researchers from the Integrated Healthcare Network of Quebec (Réseau de la Santé et des Services Sociaux - RSSS) and provincial, federal and international research funding bodies, in addition to many stakeholders and organizational networks dedicated to global healthcare. Our vision allows us to provide cutting-edge specialized healthcare and surgical services based on continually updated scientific knowledge.

The department of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine's vision

Central to its ideology and clinical planning, the Department of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine's vision was developed by the department's team of physicians, professionals and patient partners.

It includes CHUM's excellence in patient care, notably in specialized and sub-specialized care, and all aspects of the university's teaching, research, and innovation mission. Innovations such as the use of artificial intelligence and the integration of telemedicine are also being implemented by the department. Health promotion and disease prevention complete this vision.

In terms of outreach, CHUM's Department of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine has many achievements to its credit, from which it shares with its Canadian and international partners.

Role of the Head of the Department of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine

The Head of CHUM's Department of Radiology and Nuclear Medicine manages a cross-disciplinary department that, because of the mission of its services, must also have an integrated vision of CHUM's activities and maintain ties with the network and the community.

The successful applicant must have (or acquire) a solid understanding and grasp of issues specific to the practice of medical imaging in a university hospital centre with academic and superspecialized activities. This person must also understand the nuances within the organization of health care and services in Quebec, in particular the use of local service networks (LSNs), Regional medical manpower plans (PREMs) and medical manpower plans (PEMs) in order to optimize the recruitment and retention of its members and the development of the Department's services within CHUM's mission.

This person must also have experience in or knowledge of university research, in particular of programs, opportunities, and strategies that will enable targeted recruitment and ensure alignment with CHUM Research Centre (CRCHUM) researchers in areas related to our practices.

The successful applicant will be responsible for ensuring the professional development and growth of its members. This person will ensure that the Department's regulations are respected and that the medical act quality assessment committee carries out its activities in accordance with hospital regulations, respecting the values of equity, inclusion and diversity. They will also be responsible for the recruitment of department members and be able to contribute to the clinical missions of teaching and research. To that end, they must demonstrate management skills to interact effectively with members and professionals such as technologists.

Ideal candidate profile

- A visionary, facilitator, and inspirational leader who brings people together.
- Good communication skills with a variety of stakeholders at the hospital, university and network levels and with patients and their families.
- Ability to develop a departmental strategic vision that takes into account the CRCHUM's research and teaching strengths and vision as a university teaching hospital.
- Keen interest in diverse populations as well as populations with complex management requirements.
- Medical specialty with an academic background and management experience.
- Added asset: profile as a clinical researcher with research grants as an independent researcher.
