WORKFLOW	
General structure	Fellows will be at a specific site for a week at a time where they will be involved in all types of general interventional radiology procedures.
Are there times when fellows overlap and share work?	Fellows do not overlap.
How many rounds are you expected to attend? Contribute to?	Attend: Weekly Clinical Rounds, bi-weekly interventional rounds, departmental rounds; and specialized journal clubs. The fellow will attend the angio-interventional rounds when they occur (monthly).
	Contribute to: Occasional Resident Rounds. The Fellow will make at least one presentation at the Department of Radiology, Grand Rounds.

Other than rounds, are there teaching responsibilities?	Yes, fellows will give occasional lectures to technical staff at clinical meetings and lectures/in-service teaching.
	Fellows will be invited to present two or three lectures to a variety of students, residents and departments within the Faculty of Medicine.
	Twice monthly, the mentor (or supervisor) will have a teaching or case review session with the fellow
How procedure focused is the fellowship?	Heavy focus
Which procedures are you responsible for?	The clinical rotation is primarily in angiography and fluoroscopically guided interventional procedures commencing with initial referral, diagnostic evaluation, procedural work and post procedure care. Fellows are expected to be involved in the interventional clinic, assessment of hospital inpatients and patient evaluation and discharge. Options are available for US and CT guided procedures.
	The Fellow is expected to provide clinical supervision of patients, learn pre and post-procedural care, and provide on-going support and consultation to clinical services.
Additional Comments about Workflow:	This Fellowship program has been designed to allow the fellow to acquire an extensive knowledge of Vascular and Interventional Radiology involving several modalities and to develop procedural skills to a proficient level. By the end of the year, the fellow will have demonstrated proficiency and will be practicing independently. This will be achieved through a combination of clinical service, research and education.
	During the year the Fellow is expected to have had significant experience of peripheral Vascular/Renal CTA/MRA studies.
	At the end of one year, the fellows will have examined and reported 200 vascular ultrasound studies and carried out 100 Ultrasound guided interventional procedures.
