WORKFLOW		
General structure	The fellow will be at one of the 4 hospital sites for 4 weeks and the case load per fellow will generally vary between 4-12 cases per day depending on the site and the staff you are working with.	
	At two of the sites there are two or more fellows so your workload is less heavy than at the other site. There are usually one or two major cases per day, such as a UFE or TACE.	
	At the JGH you do many procedures that only require ultrasound, such as biopsies and cholecystostomy tubes, while at the other sites the abdominal fellows take care of these cases.	
Are there times when fellows overlap and share work?	Yes, at two of the hospital sites (JGH and Glen site) there are multiple fellows. At the JGH you read CTAs and intraoperative angios between procedures.	
	There are opportunities to increase your experience at the Glen site by doing patient consults and CT guided procedures.	
	All that said, there is enough volume to develop a solid skill set and knowledge base for independent practice.
