Are there times when fellows overlap and share work?	There are times when this happens, however there is enough work for all the fellows.

How many rounds are you expected to attend? Contribute to?	Attend: Orthopedic Oncology (sarcoma) rounds are held every Friday morning from 7:30am - 9:00am; Rheumatology rounds are held jointly with the Division of Rheumatology once a month on Fridays; Orthopaedics rounds are held every Thursday at 7:00am—Orthopaedically challenging cases are presented, these rounds are run by Ortho residents; Bone conference is held every Thursday at 12:00pm in the Radiology Library, the fellow is expected to prepare some cases to be discussed by the residents; Journal Club is held 4 times/year; Bone Club is held 5 times a year at the Radiology Department of St. Justine Hospital from 5:30pm - 6:30pm, The fellow is expected to select 2 cases for presentation. Contribute to: Bone conference, sarcoma rounds, bone club
Other than rounds, are there teaching responsibilities?	Teaching the residents basic interventional procedures, teaching at the viewer in CT/MR as well as in ultrasound, giving teaching rounds, presenting progress of research projects should occur regularly. As well, the fellow will be involved with teaching of the ICM II Medical student series.
How procedure focused is the fellowship?	Moderate focus Between 10-15 procedures a week.
Which procedures are you responsible for?	The fellow is expected to take charge of all MSK procedures in the department. These include arthrography of the hip, shoulder, elbow, wrist and the ankle. US guided joint and bursal injections, aspirations etc. Bone biopsies can be done by the clinical fellow under the direct supervision of the Bone staff.
