WORKFLOW

General structure	6 months doing Breast Imaging at the RVH and 6 months body imaging at MGH/RVH. At the MGH, the fellow will participate whenever the body MR sessions take place. The remainder of the time the fellows will rotate through ultrasound and CT.
Are there times when fellows overlap and share work?	Yes
How many rounds are you expected to attend? Contribute to?	Attend and contribute to: Breast—tumor board meeting every Wednesday noon, working rounds every second week. Abdominal rounds every week, daily abdominal review sessions. Every week: GI rounds, GU rounds, gyne oncology rounds, trauma rounds. Monthly: Biliary rounds



Other than rounds, are there teaching responsibilities?	The fellow will work alongside residents and students on rotation and will be responsible for teaching of junior trainees
How procedure focused is the fellowship?	Moderate to heavy focus, depending on the fellow's interest
Which procedures are you responsible for?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Breast: Stereotactic, ultrasound and MR guided core biopsies • Fine needle aspirations • Needle localizations using ultrasound or stereotactic • Abdominal: abdominal organ biopsies (liver, kidneys), prostate biopsies, thyroid biopsies, paracentesis, thoracentesis, and abscess drainages. • Responsible for the post-biopsy reading of all the interventional procedures they performed during their rotation
Additional Comments about Workflow:	<p>Expected daily case load: Mammograms 15, Ultrasounds 10, Biopsies 5 US guided, and 3 stereotactic per week, MRI (weekly) 10, Needle localization 4 (variable depending on the OR)</p> <p>Expected daily case load--Abdomen: CT rotation (12), MR rotation (7), US rotation (20 + 4 procedures)</p>
RESEARCH	
What are the Research Expectations?	Research project to be assigned by staff supervisor in Abdomen. Research is not mandatory in Breast.
How much protected time is given for research (per week)?	A half day to one full day per week of protected academic time is granted to the fellows depending on the nature of the project
CALL	
General	<p>Frequency not to exceed 1 week in 4</p> <p>Home call, except for procedures (at least 3 per week end [1-2 per site per day is the average])</p>
Responsibilities on Call:	Fellows are a resource person for the residents on-call. Their expertise may be requested for ultrasound, CT cases or interventional procedures.
Is there a call stipend?	No



Additional comments about call	The fellow will be assessed in his/her first few months to determine what type of call will be assigned. The Residency Program Director, in consultation with the Fellowship Director, shall decide on an appropriate call duty for the fellow.
